

- 10 squares 5 3/8" x 5 3/8" (A)
- 20 squares 5" x 5" (C)



Q4457 160
Spice

- 4 squares 5 3/8" x 5 3/8" (A)
- 8 squares 5" x 5" (C)
- 7 strips 3 1/2" x width of fabric (WOF) for border #1



Q4450 71
Lime

- 5 squares 5 3/8" x 5 3/8" (A)
- 10 squares 5" x 5" (C)

- 8 strips 5" x WOF for border #3





- 28 squares 5 3/8" x 5 3/8" (A)
- 36 rectangles 5" x 9 1/2" (B)
- 4 squares 9 1/2" x 9 1/2" (D)

- 5 squares 5 3/8" x 5 3/8" (A)
- 10 squares 5" x 5" (C)



885 568
Red Velvet

- 4 squares 5 3/8" x 5 3/8" (A)
- 8 squares 5" x 5" (C)
- 7 strips 1 1/2" x WOF for border #2
- 8 strips 2 1/2" x WOF for binding

1. Draw a diagonal line on the wrong size of 20 Gardenia A's, With right sides together, layer a gardenia and rum raisin A. Sew 1/4" on both sides of the drawn line. Cut apart on the drawn line. Open and press toward the rum raisin to make 2 half-square triangles. Repeat to make 20 gardenia/rum raisin half-square triangles.

In the same way, make 10 gardenia/lime half-square triangles and 10 gardenia/salmon units.


2. Align a rum raisin C on one corner of a gardenia B. Mark a diagonal line on C and sew on the marked line. Trim 1/4" beyond the sewn line, open the patch and press. In this same way, sew a salmon C to the other side to make a Flying Geese 1. Repeat to make 10 Flying Geese 1's. In this same way use gardenia B's with rum raisin C's and lime C's to make 10 Flying Geese 2's.

3. Sew 2 gardenia/lime half-square triangles, 2 gardenia/salmon half-square triangles, 4 gardenia/rum raisin half-square triangles, 2 Flying Geese 1's and 2 Flying Geese 2's together as shown below to make a block. Make 5 blocks.

4. Using the method described in step 1 for half-square triangles, make 8 half-square triangles using gardenia and spice A's and 8 half-square triangles using gardenia and red velvet A's.



5. Align a spice C on one corner of a gardenia B. Mark a diagonal line on C and sew on the marked line. Trim 1/4" beyond the sewn line, open the patch and press. Repeat to make 8 units. In the same way, make 8 units using red velvet C's and gardenia B's.



6. Using the half-square triangles from step 4 and the units from step 5 along with gardenia D's, sew 4 blocks as shown below.

7. Arrange the blocks in 3 rows of 3 blocks as shown. Sew the blocks together into rows. Sew the rows together. To make border #1, sew the spice strips together end to end. Measure the quilt from top to bottom and cut 2 lengths equal to this measurement for the border side strips. Matching centers and ends, sew these strips to the sides of the quilt top. Measure the quilt from side to side and cut 2 lengths equal to this measurement for the border top and bottom strips. Matching centers and ends, sew these strips to the top and bottom of the quilt top. Repeat this process using the red velvet strips for border #2 and the September strips for border #3.



8. Layer and baste the backing, batting and quilt top.

9. Quilt as desired. Bind with red velvet.
