All seams are ¼" wide WOF= Width of Fabric Blocks are 10" finished.

Very Important! If using obvious directional prints, please be mindful of this while you are cutting.

Cutting

Fabric A Cut (1) strip at 6 ½" WOF. Sub-cut into (5) 6 ½" squares, for Block A.

Cut (1) WOF strip at 6 ½". Sub-cut (6) 6 ½" x 2 ½" rectangles. From the balance of that strip, cut (4) 2 ½" x 10 ½" rectangles, cutting in the opposite direction. Cut (1) WOF strip at 2 ½" and sub-cut (2) 2 ½" x 10 ½" rectangles, for Block B. You will need a total of (6) 2 ½" x 10 ½" rectangles.

Cut (1) WOF strip at 5 $\frac{1}{2}$ " and sub-cut into (6) 5 $\frac{1}{2}$ " x 2" rectangles. From the balance cut (6) 2 x 8 $\frac{1}{2}$ " rectangles, for Block C. Be mindful of the direction of the print.

<u>Fabric B</u> Cut (1) strip 8 $\frac{1}{2}$ " WOF. Sub-cut into (10) 8 $\frac{1}{2}$ " x 1 $\frac{1}{2}$ " rectangles. From the balance, cut (10) 1 $\frac{1}{2}$ " x 10 $\frac{1}{2}$ " rectangles, cutting in the opposite direction. All for Block A.

Cut (1) strip at $4 \frac{1}{2}$ "WOF. Sub-cut into (6) $4 \frac{1}{2}$ " x $1 \frac{1}{2}$ " rectangles. From the balance of that strip, cut (6) $1 \frac{1}{2}$ " x $6 \frac{1}{2}$ " rectangles. All for Block B.

Cut (1) strip at 5 ½" and sub-cut into (4) 5 ½" squares. All for Block C.

<u>Fabric C</u> Cut (1) WOF strip 8 ½". Sub-cut (6) 8 ½" x 1 ½" and (2) 6 ½"x 1 ½" rectangles. Then cutting in the opposite direction, cut (6) 1 ½" x 10 ½" and (2) 1 ½" x 8 ½" rectangles.

Cut (3) 4 ½" squares.

<u>Fabric D</u> Cut (1) WOF strip 8 ½" and sub-cut into (2) 8 ½" x 1 ½" and (6) 6 ½" x 1 ½" rectangles. From the balance, cut (2) 1 ½" x 10 ½" strips and (6) 1 ½" x 8 ½" strips.

Fabric E Cut (9) 10 ½" squares.

Fabric F Cut (1) strip at 10 ½" and sub-cut into (12) 10 ½"x 2 ½" rectangles.

Cut (12) 2" squares for cornerstones.

Cut (6) strips at 2 ¼" for binding.

Fabric G Cut (1) strip 10 ½"WOF and sub-cut into (4) 10 ½" squares.

Cut (5) strips at 2" WOF and sub-cut into (18) 2" x 10 1/2" rectangles.

Fabric H Cut (2) strips at 10 ½" and sub-cut into (30) 10 ½" x 2 ½" rectangles.

Cut (24) 2" squares, for cornerstones.

Block Construction

Block A

Step 1 With Fabric D, sew (1) piece $1 \frac{1}{2}$ " x $6 \frac{1}{2}$ " to <u>each</u> side (left and right) to Fabric A $6 \frac{1}{2}$ " square.

Step 2 Also with Fabric D, sew (1) piece $1 \frac{1}{2}$ x $8 \frac{1}{2}$ to the top and bottom of Step 1.

- Step 3 With Fabric B, sew (1) 1 %" x 8 %" piece to each side (left and right) to Step 2.
- Step 4 Sew (1) $1 \frac{1}{2}$ " x $10 \frac{1}{2}$ " piece to the top and bottom of Step 3. Your block should measure $10 \frac{1}{2}$ " x $10 \frac{1}{2}$ ". Make a total of (4) blocks in this layout.
- Step 5 Make one more block of this layout using Fabrics A and C (for Steps 1 and 2) and Fabric B (for Steps 3 and 4), in that order.

Block B

- Step 6 With Fabric B, sew (1) piece (1 $\frac{1}{2}$ " x 4 $\frac{1}{2}$ ") to each side (left and right) to Fabric C 4 $\frac{1}{2}$ " square.
- Step 7 Also with Fabric B, sew (1) piece (1 $\frac{1}{2}$ " x 6 $\frac{1}{2}$ ") to the top and bottom of Step 6.
- Step 8 With Fabric A, sew (1) piece (2 $\frac{1}{2}$ " x 6 $\frac{1}{2}$ ") to each side (left and right) to Step 7.
- Step 9 Sew (1) 2 ½" x 10 ½" piece to top and bottom of Step 8. Make (3) blocks.

Block C

- Step 10 Sew (1) Fabric A 2" x 5 ½" rectangle to the sides (left and right) of Fabric B square.
- Step 11 Sew (1) 2 x 8 ½" Fabric A rectangle to the top and bottom of Step 10.
- Step 12 Sew (1) Fabric C 1 ½" x 8 ½" rectangle to the left and right sides of Step 11.
- Step 13 Sew (1) Fabric C 1 $\frac{1}{2}$ " x 10 $\frac{1}{2}$ " rectangle to the top and bottom of Step 12. Make a total of 3 blocks.
- Step 14 Make a fourth Block C, but use Fabric D for Steps 12 and 13. At this point, you should have 12 pieced blocks.

Sewing the Blocks Together

Using a color copy (print out) of the quilt will be the most helpful. Essentially the blocks are sewn in (5) rows as follows...

Row 1 (left to right) consists of Fabric G strip, Fabric E square, Fabric H strip, Block A, Fabric H strip, Fabric E square, Fabric F strip, Block B, Fabric F strip, Fabric E square and Fabric G strip.

Row 2 (left to right) consists of Fabric F strip, Block B, Fabric F strip, Fabric G square, Fabric H strip, Block C, Fabric H strip, Fabric G square, Fabric H strip, Block A and Fabric G strip.

Row 3 (left to right) consists of Fabric G strip, Fabric E square, Fabric H strip, Block A, Fabric H strip, Fabric E square, Fabric H strip, Block C (with light outer border), Fabric H strip, Fabric E square and Fabric G strip.

Row 4 (left to right) consists of Fabric G strip, Block C, Fabric strip H, Fabric G square, Fabric F strip, Block B, Fabric F strip, Fabric G square, Fabric H strip, Block A (with dark inner border) and Fabric G strip.

Row 5 (left to right) consists of Fabric G strip, Fabric E square, Fabric H strip, Block A, Fabric H strip, Fabric E square, Fabric H strip, Block C, Fabric H strip, Fabric E square and Fabric G strip.

Sewing the Rows Together

The rows will be attached to each other with a horizontal sashing in between. As you are matching the seams, make sure your seam allowances are going in opposite directions. And again using a color print out of the quilt will be the most helpful, for fabric placement, but in the event a color printer is unavailable, please use the following...

Very top row (left to right) Fabric H square, Fabric G strip, Fabric H square, Fabric G strip, Fabric F square, Fabric F square, Fabric F square, Fabric G strip and Fabric H square.

For the sashing between rows 1 and 2 (left to right) Fabric F square, Fabric F strip, Fabric F square, Fabric H strip, Fabric H square, Fabric H strip, Fabric F square, Fabric F strip, Fabric F square, Fabric H strip and Fabric H square.

For the sashing between rows 2 and 3 (left to right) Fabric F square, Fabric F strip, Fabric F square, Fabric H strip, Fabric H square, Fabric H square, Fabric H square, Fabric H square.

For the sashing between rows 3 and 4 (left to right) Fabric H square, Fabric H strip, Fabric H square, Fabric F square, Fabric F square, Fabric H strip, Fabric H square.

For the sashing between rows 4 and 5 (left to right) Fabric H square, Fabric H strip, Fabric F square, Fabric F square, Fabric F square, Fabric H square, Fabric H square.

Last row of sashing! Left to right- Fabric H square, Fabric G strip, Fabric H square, Fabric G strip, Fabric H square, Fabric G strip, Fabric G strip, Fabric G strip, Fabric G strip, Fabric H square, Fabric G strip and Fabric H square.

The top is done!

Sandwich the batting between the top and the bottom of the quilt. The backing and the batting should extend at least 4" beyond the edges of the top. Quilt as desired, trim to approximately 60" x 60" and add the binding.
