

Cutting

From fabric A, cut:

• (2) 8 $\frac{1}{2}$ " x 42" WOF strips; cut into (6) 8 $\frac{1}{2}$ " squares

From fabric B, cut:

• (1) 8 $\frac{1}{2}$ " x 42" WOF strips; cut into (4) 8 $\frac{1}{2}$ " squares

From fabric C, cut:

• (2) 8 $\frac{1}{2}$ " x 42" WOF strips; cut into (6) 8 $\frac{1}{2}$ " squares

From fabric D, cut:

• (6) 4 $\frac{1}{2}$ " x 42" WOF border strips. Piece the strips and cut (2) 4 $\frac{1}{2}$ " x 50 $\frac{1}{2}$ " strips and (2) 4 $\frac{1}{2}$ " x 58 $\frac{1}{2}$ " strips.

From fabric E, cut:

- (2) 3" x 42" strips; cut into (16) 3" squares
- (8) 2 ½" x 42" strips; cut into (128) 2 ½" squares
- (5) 1 $\frac{1}{2}$ " x 42" border strips. Piece the strips and cut (2) 1 $\frac{1}{2}$ " x 48 $\frac{1}{2}$ " strips and (2) 1 $\frac{1}{2}$ " x 62 $\frac{1}{2}$ " strips.

From fabric F, cut:

• (2) 3" x 42" strips; cut into (16) 3" squares

From fabric G, cut:


- (4) 4 $\frac{1}{2}$ " x 42" strips; cut into (64) 2 $\frac{1}{2}$ " x 4 $\frac{1}{2}$ " rectangles
- (2) 8 $\frac{1}{2}$ " x 42" strips; cut into (32) 2 $\frac{1}{2}$ " x 8 $\frac{1}{2}$ " rectangles

From fabric H, cut:


- (2) 2 $\frac{1}{2}$ " x 42" strips; cut into (32) 2 $\frac{1}{2}$ " squares
- (6) 2 1/4" x 42" binding strips

Making the Blocks


1. Draw a diagonal line from corner to corner on the wrong side of each fabric E 2 $\frac{1}{2}$ " square. Place a marked square on one end of a fabric G 2 $\frac{1}{2}$ " x 4 $\frac{1}{2}$ " rectangle, right sides together. Sew along the marked line and trim away the corner fabric, leaving a $\frac{1}{4}$ " seam allowance. Repeat to make a total of 32 units and 32 reversed units.




2. Sew one unit and one reversed unit together to make a side unit. Make 32 units.



3. Using 24 of the marked squares from step 1, place a marked square on each corner of a fabric A square. Sew along the marked line and trim away the corner fabric, leaving a $\frac{1}{4}$ " seam allowance. Make six fabric A center units.



- 4. In the same way, use 8 marked squares and the fabric C squares to make two fabric C center units.
- 5. Lay out four side units from step 2, four fabric H squares, and one fabric A center unit as shown (upper-right). Join the pieces into rows and then join the rows to complete one A block. Make a total of six A blocks.




- 6. Repeat step 5, using the remaining side units, fabric H squares, and fabric C center units to make two C blocks.
- 7. Repeat step 3, using 16 marked squares from step 1 and the fabric B squares to make four fabric B center units.
- 8. Repeat step 3, using the remaining marked squares from step 1 and the fabric C squares to make four more fabric C center units.
- 9. Draw a diagonal line from corner to corner on the wrong side of each fabric F square. Layer a marked square right sides together with a fabric E 3" square. Sew $\frac{1}{4}$ " from each side of the marked line. Cut the squares apart on the marked line to make two half-square-triangle units. Trim the units to measure $2\frac{1}{2}$ " square. Make a total of 32 units.





10. Lay out four units from step 9, four fabric G $2\frac{1}{2}$ " x $8\frac{1}{2}$ " rectangles, and one fabric B center unit as shown below. Join the pieces into rows and then

join the rows to complete one B block. Make a total of four B blocks.



11. Repeat step 10, using the remaining half-square-triangle units, fabric G 2 $\frac{1}{2}$ " x 8 $\frac{1}{2}$ " rectangles, and fabric C center units to make four C blocks.

Assembling the Quilt

- 12. Lay out the blocks in four rows of four blocks each, alternating them as shown in the quilt photo. Join the blocks into rows and then join the rows to complete the quilt-top center. The quilt-top center should measure $48\frac{1}{2}$ " square.
- 13. Sew the fabric E 48 $\frac{1}{2}$ "-long strips to opposite sides of the quilt top. Sew the fabric E 50 $\frac{1}{2}$ "-long strips to the top and bottom of the quilt top to complete the inner border.
- 14. Sew the fabric D 50 $\frac{1}{2}$ "-long strips to opposite sides of the quilt top. Sew the fabric D 58 $\frac{1}{2}$ "-long strips to the top and bottom of the quilt top to complete the outer border.
- 15. Layer the quilt top with batting and backing; baste. Quilt as desired. Using the fabric H 2 $\frac{1}{4}$ "-wide strips, bind the edges to finish.
