Frosty Feathers-Table toppers of different sizes

This project creates five - 15 inch blocks that can be sewn together as a long table runner, plus used individually as small toppers. The focal fabric is a wintery scene. Use this fabric as the center of your blocks by fussy cutting individual birds. From the 1/3 yard of fabric suggested you should be able to fussy cut 5 bird images.

Fabric Requirements: Below are two color way options to choose from.

Dark	R7685 Onyx Silver	R7684 Navy Silver

Yardages needed are as follows, the amounts given are to make 1 table runner using three blocks <u>and</u> 2 table toppers made from a single block (each). Adjustments would need to be made if you are making different configurations.

Focal	1/3 yd
Star Points and border	1 yd
Background	5/8 yd
Accent	¹⁄₄ yd
Dark	3/8 yd

Fabric Cutting: Cutting is listed for making 5 blocks

Focal fabric – Fussy cut 5 bird images as 5 ½ inch squares.

Star points and borders – Cut (2) strips 5 7/8 inches by the width of fabric (WOF). Sub cut into (10) – 5 7/8 squares. Cut the squares in half, once along the diagonal to form 2 triangles from each square for a total of 20 triangles. The remainder of the fabric will be used as borders. The borders are cut at $2\frac{1}{2}$ inches.




Diagram for single diagonal cut

Background – Cut (1) strip 6 $\frac{1}{4}$ by WOF. Sub cut this into (5) – 6 $\frac{1}{4}$ inch squares. These 6 $\frac{1}{4}$ inch squares will be cut twice, or across both diagonals to form 4 triangles for a total of 20 for the project.




Diagram of double diagonal cut

Cut 2 strips of background fabric at 5 7/8inches by WOF. Sub cut into (10) - 5 7/8 inch squares, and then cut these squares once across the diagonal to create a total of 20 triangles, just like with the star point fabric.

Accent – Cut (1) strip 6 $\frac{1}{4}$ by WOF. Sub cut into (5) – 6 $\frac{1}{4}$ inch squares and cut twice across the diagonals to create a total of 20 triangles.

Dark – Cut (2) strips 5 7/8 inch by WOF. Sub cut into (10) – 5 7/8 inch squares and cut once across the diagonal of each square to create 20 triangle units.


Creating the block:

First sew together the dark and the larger background triangles (the ones made from the 5 7/8 squares) along their diagonals. Press the seam allowance to the dark side. You will have created 20 half square triangles.




Half square diagram

Next sew the accent triangles to the smaller background triangles. The accent triangle will always be on the left. Note orientation in the diagram below. Sew this unit to the star point triangles along the diagonal and press the seam allowance toward the star point side.

Finally, let's join these units to make our block. It makes a large 9-patch unit. The fussy cut birds will be the center of this block. The background/dark half square triangles will be in the four corners with the dark fabric facing the outside. The star-point units need to be oriented around the focal fabric to create a star. (Oops –on the project sheet you can see my error, I have one of these units twisted the wrong way and I did not notice it until I saw the photo. Learn from my mistakes.) Follow the diagram following for the block and sew these units into rows and then the rows together into the block. The block should measure 15 ½ inches unfinished.

Borders:

Sew the blocks together into configurations that fit your needs. They will then be bordered using the remaining star point fabric. The borders are cut at $2\frac{1}{2}$ inches.
