#### PLEASE READ ALL INSTRUCTIONS BEFORE BEGINNING

General instructions

- \* All seams are sewn with 1/4".
- \* Press seams in the direction of the arrows unless instructed otherwise.
- \* Place the cut strips in baggies by size and color to lessen confusion for piecing.
- \* Make templates A, B, and C on page 5 out of heavy template material.
- \* HST refers to Half-Square Triangles; squares cut once diagonally into two triangles.
- \* QST refers to Quarter-Square Triangles; squares cut twice diagonally into four triangles.

## CUTTING INSTRUCTIONS (Based on 42" Width of fabric - WOF)

#### Fabric 1

\* Cut three 3-7/8" x WOF strips; sub-cut into thirty 3-7/8" squares.

#### Fabric 2

\* Cut three 3-7/8" x WOF strips; sub-cut into thirty 3-7/8" squares.

#### Fabric 3

- \* Cut three 1-7/8" x WOF strips; sub-cut into sixty 1-7/8" squares
- \* Cut three 3-5/8" x WOF strips. With fabric folded lengthwise wrong sides together, cut sixty left and sixty right Template A patches. (The left and right patches will be cut at the same time.)

#### Fabric 3 cont'

Cut seventeen 1-5/8" x WOF strips; sub-cut into sixty 1-5/8" x 7-3/4" and sixty 1-5/8" x 3-1/4". Cut two 5-1/4" x WOF strips; sub-cut into twelve 5-1/4" squares, then cut twice diagonally into forty-eight QST. From remainder of strip: Cut four 2-7/8" squares; cut once diagonally into eight HST.

Cut six 2" x WOF strips for border 1.

#### Fabric 4

Cut two 3-5/8" x WOF strips. With Template B cut thirty triangles.

Cut one 4-1/4" x WOF strips; sub-cut into eight 4-1/4" squares. Cut squares twice diagonally to make thirty-two QST.

#### Fabric 5

Cut two 3-5/8" x WOF strips. With Template B cut thirty triangles.

Cut one 4-1/4" x WOF strips; sub-cut into eight 4-1/4" squares. Cut squares twice diagonally to make thirty-two QST.

Cut two 5-1/4" x WOF strips; sub-cut into thirteen 5-1/4" squares; then cut twice diagonally into fifty-two QST. From remainder of strip: Cut four 2-1/2" squares.

Cut six 1-1/2" x WOF strips for border 3. Cut seven 2-1/4" x WOF strips for binding.

#### Fabric 6

Cut nine 1-5/8" x WOF strips; sub-cut into sixty 1-5/8" x 5-1/2".

#### Fabric 7

Cut one 6-7/8" x WOF strips; sub-cut into six 6-7/8" squares.

Cut seven 4" x WOF strips for border 5.

#### Fabric 8

Cut two 6-7/8" x WOF strips; sub-cut into nine 6-7/8" squares.

#### Fabric 9


Cut six 1-1/2" x WOF strips for border 4.

#### **BLOCK CONSTRUCTION**

#### BLOCK 1 Make 15


- 1. Draw a diagonal line on the backs of the thirty 3-7/8" *Fabric 2* squares.
- 2. Place a 3-7/8" *Fabric 2* square right sides together on a 3-7/8" *Fabric 1* square. Sew 1/4"

on each side of the drawn line. Trim down center of the block and press towards *Fabric 1*. Make 60 HST units.






- 3. Draw a diagonal line on the backs of the 1-7/8" *Fabric 3* squares.
- 4. Place square right sides together on the *Fabric 2* side of the HST. Sew along drawn line. Trim seam to 1/4". Press to *Fabric 3*. Repeat with remaining HST.






4. Sew a *Fabric 3* A patch to each side of a *Fabric 4* B patch. Press to *Fabric 3*. Make 30 A/B 1 units. 5. Repeat step four with the *Fabric 5* B patches. Make 30 A/B 2 units.








- 6. Sew a 4-1/4" *Fabric 4* QST to a 4-1/4" *Fabric 5* QST. Press to *Fabric 5*. Make 30.
- 7. Sew one *Fabric 4/5* QST patch to another *Fabric 4/5* QST. Press to one side. Make 15 QST units.






8. Sew four HST units, two A/B 1 units, two A/B 2 units, and one QST unit together, matching the fabric on the A/B unit to the same fabric on the QST unit. Sew blocks across together. Then sew rows together. Press in the direction of the arrows. Make 15.



#### BLOCK 2a

9. Following the illustration, sew the 1-5/8" x 3-1/4" *Fabric 3*, 1-5/8" x 5-1/2" *Fabric 6*, and 1-5/8" x 7-3/4" *Fabric 3* rectangles together, matching centers. Press to *Fabric 6*. Make 60.



10. Using Template C, line up bottom of the template on the bottom of the strip set and cut out the triangle.



11. Sew a triangle unit from step 10 to each side of a 6-7/8" *Fabric 7* square. Press to triangles. Make 6.



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12. Repeat step 11 with the remaining triangle units and the 6-7/8" *Fabric 8* squares. Make 9.



# QUILT CONSTRUCTION (Illustration on following page.)

13. Using the illustration for block placement, arrange blocks five across and six down. Alternate Blocks 1, 2a, and 2b.

#### **BORDER CONSTRUCTION**

14. Sew the six 2" *Fabric 3* strips short ends together. Trim two strips to 54-1/2". Sew to sides of the quilt. Press to border.

15. Trim remaining strip to two 48-1/2". Sew to top and bottom. Press to border.

16. Starting with a 2-7/8" *Fabric 3* HST sew a 5-1/4" *Fabric 5* QST, then a 5-1/2" *Fabric 3* QST, and continue to alternate the *Fabric 5* and *Fabric 3* QSTs for fourteen *Fabric 5* and thirteen *Fabric 3* total. Finish with a 2-7/8" *Fabric 3* HST. (Strip should equal 56-1/2".) Press in direction of strip just sewn. Make 2. Sew to sides of quilt. Press to border. 1.



Sew 14 Fab. 9 OST and 13 Fab. 3 OST and finish with HST.

17. Repeat step 16 with twelve *Fabric 5* QST and eleven *Fabric 3* QST. (Strip should equal 48-1/2".) Sew a 2-1/2" *Fabric 3* square to each end. Press to square. Make 2. Sew to top and bottom of quilt. Press to border 1.



Sew 12 Fab. 9 QST and 11 Fab. 3 QST.

18. Sew the 1-1/2" *Fabric 5* strips together. Measure through the vertical center of the quilt. Trim two strips to this length and sew to sides.


- 19. Measure through the horizontal center and trim two strips to this measurement with the remaining strip. Sew to top and bottom.
- 20. Repeat steps 18 and 19 with the 1-1/2" Fabric 9 strips and finishing with the 4" Fabric 7 strips.


#### **FINISHING**

- 21. Layer top, batting, and pieced backing and quilt as desired.
- 22. Stitch the seven 2-1/4" Fabric 5 binding strips together end to end using diagonal seams. Fold and press the resulting long strip in half lengthwise with wrong sides together. Stitch to the quilt front, matching raw edges and mitering the corners.
- 23. Fold the binding to the quilt underside and hand-stitch the folded edge to the quilt back.
