

Cutting

From fabric A, cut:

- 4 squares, $9 \frac{1}{2}$ " x $9 \frac{1}{2}$ "

From fabric B, cut:

- 4 squares, $9 \frac{1}{2}$ " x $9 \frac{1}{2}$ "

From fabric C, cut:

- 4 squares, $9 \frac{1}{2}$ " x $9 \frac{1}{2}$ "

From fabric D, cut:

- 4 squares, $9 \frac{1}{2}$ " x $9 \frac{1}{2}$ "

From fabric E, cut:

- 5 strips, $4 \frac{7}{8}$ " x 42"; crosscut into 36 squares, $4 \frac{7}{8}$ " x $4 \frac{7}{8}$ "
- 9 strips, $1 \frac{3}{4}$ " x 42". Piece strips and cut 2 strips, $1 \frac{3}{4}$ " x $80 \frac{1}{2}$ " and 2 strips, $1 \frac{3}{4}$ " x 83".
- 9 binding strips, $2 \frac{1}{4}$ " x 42"

From fabric F, cut:

- 5 strips, $4 \frac{7}{8}$ " x 42"; crosscut into 36 squares, $4 \frac{7}{8}$ " x $4 \frac{7}{8}$ "
- 7 strips, $3 \frac{7}{8}$ " x 42"; crosscut into 64 squares, $3 \frac{7}{8}$ " x $3 \frac{7}{8}$ "
- 6 strips, $3 \frac{1}{2}$ " x 42"; crosscut into 64 squares, $3 \frac{1}{2}$ " x $3 \frac{1}{2}$ "
- 4 strips, $6 \frac{1}{2}$ " x 42"
- 4 squares, $4 \frac{1}{2}$ " x $4 \frac{1}{2}$ "

Quilt Construction

From fabric G, cut:


- 6 strips, $3\frac{1}{2}$ " x 42"; crosscut into 64 squares, $3\frac{1}{2}$ " x $3\frac{1}{2}$ "
- 2 strips, $3\frac{1}{2}$ " x 42"
- 2 strips, 2" x 42"; crosscut into 25 squares, 2" x 2"

From fabric H, cut:


- 7 strips, $3\frac{7}{8}$ " x 42"; crosscut into 64 squares, $3\frac{7}{8}$ " x $3\frac{7}{8}$ "
- 8 strips, $2\frac{3}{4}$ " x 42". Piece strips and cut 2 strips, $2\frac{3}{4}$ " x $72\frac{1}{2}$ " and 2 strips, $2\frac{3}{4}$ " x 68".

Block Construction

1. Layer one fabric F $3\frac{7}{8}$ " square right sides together with a fabric H square. Draw a diagonal line on the wrong side of the top square. Sew $\frac{1}{4}$ " on each side of the drawn line. Cut the squares apart on the line to make two half-square-triangle units. Press the seam allowances toward the darker triangle. The units should measure $3\frac{1}{2}$ " square. Repeat to make a total of 128 units.
2. Join two units from step 1 and one fabric G $3\frac{1}{2}$ " square as shown to make a side unit. Make 64 units.



3. Join four side units, four fabric F $3\frac{1}{2}$ " squares, and one fabric A square as shown to make a block. Make four fabric A blocks. Repeat to make four fabric B blocks, four fabric C blocks, and four fabric D blocks.



4. To make the sashing strips, sew fabric F $6\frac{1}{2}$ "-wide strips to both long edges of each fabric G $3\frac{1}{2}$ "-wide strip to make a 2 strip sets. Cut the strip sets into 40 segments, 2" wide.
5. Join five fabric G 2" squares and four sashing strips from step 4, beginning with a square and alternating them as shown in the photo to make a sashing row. Press the seam allowances toward the sashing strips. Make five rows.
6. Join five sashing strips from step 4 and four blocks, beginning with a sashing strip and alternating them as shown in the photo to make a block row. Press the seam allowances toward the sashing strips. Make four rows.
7. Sew the block rows and sashing rows together, beginning with a sashing row and alternating them as shown in the photo. Press the seam allowances toward the sashing rows. The quilt top should measure 68" x 68".
8. Sew the fabric H 68"-long strips to the sides of the quilt top. Sew the fabric H $72\frac{1}{2}$ "-long strips to the top and bottom of the quilt top to complete the inner border. The quilt top should measure $72\frac{1}{2}$ " x $72\frac{1}{2}$ ".
9. Repeat step 1, using the fabric E and fabric F $4\frac{7}{8}$ " squares to make 72 half-square-triangle units. The units should measure $4\frac{1}{2}$ " square.
10. Join 18 units from step 9 as shown in the photo to make a border unit. Repeat to make a second border unit. Sew the border units to opposite sides of the quilt top.
11. Join 18 units from step 9 and two fabric F $4\frac{1}{2}$ " squares as shown in the photo to make a top border unit. Repeat to make a bottom border unit. Sew the units to the top/bottom of the quilt top.
12. Sew the fabric E $80\frac{1}{2}$ "-long strips to the sides of the quilt top. Sew fabric E 83"-long strips to the top and bottom of the quilt top to complete the outer border.
13. Layer the quilt top with batting and backing; baste. Quilt as desired. Using the fabric E $2\frac{1}{4}$ "-wide strips, bind the edges to finish.
