Specification: Intermediate Approximately 76" x 94" WOF=Width of Fabric LOF=Length of Fabric

Cutting Instructions

From Fabric A, cut for

a. block centers

Cut (1) 17" x 17" square centering on 1 print repeat. Cut into (4) 8 % " x 8 % " squares, for fractured block center for 4 blocks at bottom right of quilt. From the remaining width, fussy-cut (2) 8 %" squares.

Cut (1) 8 ½" x 8 ½" WOF strip and sub-cut (4) more 8 ½" squares, for a total of 10.



b. block framing pieces

Cut (1) 20" x 42" WOF. Being that this fabric is directional, cut in the following order...

- 1. 20" x 14 ½" piece and sub-cut (6) 2 ½ " x 14 ½ " and (2) 2 ½" x 10 ½" WOF.
- 2. (6) 2 $\frac{1}{2}$ " x 16 $\frac{1}{2}$ " and (2) 2 $\frac{1}{2}$ " x 12 $\frac{1}{2}$ " LOF. Parallel to selvedge.

From Fabric B, cut for

- a. block centers (1) 8 $\frac{1}{2}$ " x 42" WOF. Sub-cut (4) 8 $\frac{1}{2}$ " x 8 $\frac{1}{2}$ " squares.
- b. block framing pieces (1) 16 % " x 42" WOF. Sub-cut (5) 2 % " x 16 % " and (5) 2 % " x 14 %" rectangles.

From Fabric C, cut for

a. block centers (1) 8 ½" x 42". Sub-cut into (2) 8 ½" x 8 ½" squares.

From Fabric D, cut for

- a. block centers (1) 8 ½ " x 42" WOF. Sub-cut (4) 8 ½ " x 8 ½ " squares.
- b. block framing pieces (1) 12 % " x 42" WOF. Sub-cut (7) 2 % " x 12 % " and (9) 2 % " x 10 % " rectangles.
- (1) 16 % " x 42" WOF. Sub-cut (3) 2 % " x 16 % ", (3) 2 % " x 14 % " and (2) 2 % " x 12 1/2" rectangles.

From Fabric E, cut for

- a. block framing pieces
- (1) 12 $\frac{1}{2}$ " x 42" WOF. Sub-cut (5) 2 $\frac{1}{2}$ " x 12 $\frac{1}{2}$ " and (5) 2 $\frac{1}{2}$ " x 10 $\frac{1}{2}$ " rectangles.
- (1) 16 ½ " x 42" WOF. Sub-cut (6) 2 ½ " x 16 ½ " and (6) 2 ½ " x 14 ½ " rectangles.

Plus (7) 2 ¼ " strips for binding. Piece strips to make a continuous strip.

From Fabric F, cut for

a.block framing pieces (3) 2 ½" x 42" WOF. Sub-cut (4) 2 ½" x 12 ½" and (4) 2 ½" x 10 ½" rectangles.

From Fabric G, cut for


- a. block framing pieces
- (1) 8 ½ " x 42" WOF. Sub-cut (16) 2 ½ " x 8 ½ " rectangles.
- (1) 10 ½ " x 42" WOF. Sub-cut (16) 2 ½ " x 10 ½ " rectangles.
- (1) 12 $\frac{1}{2}$ " x 42" WOF. Sub-cut (16) 2 $\frac{1}{2}$ " x 12 $\frac{1}{2}$ " rectangles.
- (2) 14 $\frac{1}{2}$ " x 42" WOF. Sub-cut (20) 2 $\frac{1}{2}$ " x 14 $\frac{1}{2}$ ", (4) 2 $\frac{1}{2}$ " x 12 $\frac{1}{2}$ ", (4) 2 $\frac{1}{2}$ " x 10 $\frac{1}{2}$ " and (4) 2 $\frac{1}{2}$ " x 8 $\frac{1}{2}$ " rectangles.
- b. sashing pieces

- (1) 16 ½ " x 42" WOF. Sub-cut (15) 2 ½ " x 16 ½ " rectangles.
- (7) 2 ½ " x 42" WOF. Piece and sub-cut (4) 2 ½ " x 67 ½ " strips.
- c. outside borders


Cut (8) 3 ½ x 42" WOF. Piece (at short ends) to make a continuous strip.

Constructing Block (using top left block as example):


1. Sew (1) 2 % " x 8 % " Fabric G background rectangle to the top of (1) 8 % " x 8 % " Fabric B block center. Sew (1) 2 % " x 10 % " Fabric G rectangle to the left.



2. Add to the top of sewn unit (1) 2 % " x 10 % " Fabric D rectangle, and to the left (1) 2 % " x 12 % " Fabric D rectangle.



3. Add to the top of sewn unit (1) 2 % " x 12 % " Fabric G and to the left (1) 2 % " x 14 % " Fabric G rectangle.



4. Add to the top of sewn unit (1) 2 ½ " x 14 ½ " Fabric A rectangle, and to the left (1) 2 ½ " x 16 ½ " Fabric A rectangle to complete 1 block. Because Fabric A is directional, take a moment and orientate the proper print layout(s). Refer to quilt photo.



5. Repeat to make a total number of blocks in the following colorways:

4 blocks







Constructing Quilt Top:

1. Quilt Center.

Arrange and sew together 4 blocks and (3) 2 % " x 16 % " Fabric G sashing rectangles into a row.





Row 4 (note the 3rd and 4th block from left are top left and top right fracture blocks)



Row 5 (note the 3rd and 4th block from left are bottom left and bottom right fracture blocks)



Sew rows and (4) 2 $\frac{1}{2}$ " x 67 $\frac{1}{2}$ " Fabric G sashing strips to complete quilt center.



2. Outer border. Sew (2) 3 % " x 88 % " Fabric G strips to the opposite long sides of quilt center. Sew (2) 3 % " x 76 % " Fabric G strips to the remaining opposite short sides of quilt center to complete quilt top.



Quilting Instructions:

- 1. With the backing fabric laying taut, place batting and then quilt top to form quilt sandwich. Baste sandwich.
- 2. Quilt as desired.
- 3. Bind to finish quilt.
