- WOF = Width Of Fabric from selvage edge to selvage edge.
- SC = Sub Cut the WOF strips into smaller sections as indicated in cutting directions.
- * RST = Right Sides Together
- ❖ HST = Half Square Triangle
- ❖ Use scant ¼" seam allowance throughout.
- Press seams open to help reduce bulk or you could also press all seams toward the darker fabric.
- Mark fabric sections as you cut them with the letter indicated in [brackets] in the cutting instructions.
- All images below are shown in Colorway 1

Fabric 1: Eight Leaf Blocks

Cut one strip 6.5" x WOF; SC (8) 3.5" x 6.5" [D] Cut one strip 3.5" x WOF; SC (8) 3.5" squares [C] Cut two strips 4.5" x WOF; SC (16) 4.5" squares [B]

Fabric 3: Seven Leaf Blocks

Cut one strip 6.5" x WOF; SC (7) 3.5" x 6.5" [D] Cut one strip 3.5" x WOF; SC (7) 3.5" squares [C] Cut two strips 4.5" x WOF; SC (14) 4.5" squares [B]

Fabric 5: Twelve Leaf Blocks

Cut one strip 6.5" x WOF; SC (12) 3.5" x .5" [D] Cut one strip 3.5" x WOF; SC (12) 3.5" squares [C] Cut three 4.5" x WOF; SC (24) 4.5" squares [B]

Fabric 2: Eight Leaf Blocks

Cut one strip 6.5" x WOF; SC (8) 3.5" x 6.5" [D] Cut one strip 3.5" x WOF; SC (8) 3.5" squares [C] Cut two strips 4.5" x WOF; SC (16) 4.5" squares [B]

Quilt size: 72" x 84"

Fabric 4: Seven Leaf Blocks

Cut one strip 6.5" x WOF; SC (7) 3.5" x 6.5" [D] Cut one strip 3.5" x WOF; SC (7) 3.5" squares [C] Cut two strips 4.5" x WOF; SC (14) 4.5" squares [B]

Fabric 6: Binding

Cut eight strips 2.5" x WOF

Fabric 7: Leaf Stems

Cut two strips 5.5" x WOF; SC (42) 1.25" x 5.5" [F]

Fabric 8: Background

Cut four strips 3.75" x WOF; SC (42) 3.75 squares. Cut in half on the diagonal once to yield 84 triangles. [E] Cut ten strips 4.5" x WOF; SC (84) 4.5" squares. Draw one diagonal line across back of each square. [B]

Cut four strips 9.5" x WOF; SC (42) 3.5" x 9.5" rectangles. [H]

Cut four strips 12.5" x WOF; SC (42) 3.5" x 12.5" rectangles [J]

Cut four strips 3.5" x WOF; SC (42) 3.5" squares. [G]

<u>Backing:</u> Cut backing fabric into two pieces, each 2.5 yards long. Seam approximately 1/2" in from selvage edges. Trim away selvage edges leaving approximately 1/4" seam allowance. Seam will run vertically down the middle of the back of your quilt. Set aside.

<u>Binding:</u> Sew binding strips end to end along 45 degree diagonal line. Trim seam allowances to ¼" and press seams open. Fold binding in half and press lengthwise to make double-fold binding. Set aside.



←Using all fabric pieces labeled [B] and all Fabric 8 [B] pieces, match a background square RST with one of the non-background fabrics. Stitch along each side of the drawn line using scant ¼" seam allowance. Cut along drawn line so each square will yield two HSTs. Press seam and square up all HSTs to 3.5" square.



←Using all Fabric 7 [F] pieces and all Fabric 8 [E] triangles, fold triangle in half point to point along long side to find center and finger press a crease where the center of the long side is. Fold F pieces in half to finger press a center mark. Match the center marks of one triangle to leaf stem and stitch. Repeat with a second triangle and sew it centered to the other wide of the leaf stem. Press seams. Using a ruler with a 45 degree line on it, align the ruler so the corner of the ruler

is on the upper right corner of the stem fabric area and the <u>45 degree line should run down the center of the stem fabric piece from upper right to lower left</u>. You will be trimming these blocks to 3.5" square so make sure you are properly aligned before cutting off the excess fabric on the right side of the block and across the top. Turn the block 90 degrees, aligning the ruler on the 3.5" marks on the lower left side which you just squared up and the 45 degree line running along the center of the stem fabric and trim remaining two sides so you have a 3.5" square.



←Using <u>half</u> the HSTs you previously made from <u>each</u> fabric, make pairs making sure they are oriented the same as the image at left.

You will have 8 pairs for Fabric 1, 8 for Fabric 2, 7 for Fabric 3, 7 for Fabric 4, and 12 for Fabric 5. Set aside.




←With remaining HSTs, stitch into pairs to match image at left – please note the difference in the orientation. You will have 8 pairs for Fabric 1, 8 for Fabric 2, 7 for Fabric 3, 7 for Fabric 4, and 12 for Fabric 5.

Stitch Fabric 8 pieces labeled [G] to top of these pairs just made. Set aside.



←Stitch a leaf stem block to the left side of each [C] square.



Stitch a matching fabric [D] piece to the top of each stem section made in previous step.




←Stitch a matching fabric HST pair to the top of section added in last step.



←Stitch the HST pair with the background square at the top to the right side of the block.


You will have a total of 42 leaf blocks and at this point they will measure 9.5" square.

Next you will be adding two Fabric 8 background strips [H] and [J] to each block but they do not get sewn to the same side of the block on all blocks so please make sure your blocks will match the images below before stitching. Always add piece [H] first. I have marked its placement on the images below



Add H to left of leaf block and then J to top as follows:


- Make 1 block using leaf made from Fabric 1.
 - Make 2 blocks using leaves made from Fabric 2.
 - Make 3 blocks using leaves made from Fabric 3.
 - Make 5 blocks using leaves made from Fabric 4.
 - Make 8 blocks using leaves made from Fabric 5.



Add H to right of leaf block and then J to bottom as follows:

- Make 7 blocks using leaves made from Fabric 1.
 - Make 6 blocks using leaves made from Fabric 2.
 - Make 4 blocks using leaves made from Fabric 3.
 - Make 2 blocks using leaves made from Fabric 4.
 - Make 4 blocks using leaves made from Fabric 5.

Leaf blocks will now measure 12.5" square.



Lay blocks out into rows as shown. Stitch into rows. Join rows to each other. Layer, quilt, bind and enjoy.
