Happy's Place

Finished size: 59 ½" x 73 ½" Please read all instructions before beginning. All seams are ¼".

Materials:

- 2 ¼ yards Raven black
- % yard Sun yellow
- ¾ yard Squash orange
- ¾ yard Bluegrass light aqua
- ½ yard Cypress dark green
- ⁵⁄₃ yard Caterpillar light green
- 34 yard Pansy purple
- % yard Fog light gray 1 yard Bayou teal (includes binding)
- 1 yard Bayou tear (incit ½ yard Camel tan
- ½ yard Cavenne darker orange
- 1 yard Iceberg white
- 3 % yards backing fabric

Recommended: Quilt in a Day Triangle Square Up ruler

Cutting directions:

The 3" squares for all block half square triangles are oversized. If you sew perfectly and prefer not to trim, cut all squares for block half square triangles 2 %". From the Raven fabric, cut:

- (2) 6 ½" x WOF (width of fabric) strips. Sub-cut:
 (1) 6 ½" x 27 ½" rectangle for wonky geese and
 (10) 2 ½" squares for checkerboard
 (1) 6 ½" x 24 ½" rectangle for wonky geese and
 (12) 2 ½" squares for checkerboard
- (2) 5 ¹/₂" x WOF strips for right side outer border.
- (5) 3" x WOF strips. Sub-cut:
 (56) 3" squares for wonky stars and
 (5) 3" squares for block half square triangles.
- (5) 2 ½" x WOF strips. Set aside (3) 2 ½" x WOF strips for top and bottom outer borders. From (2) strips, sub-cut:

(3) 2 ½" x 9 ½" rectangles for star backgrounds and
(13) 2 ½" squares for checkerboard.

• (8) 2" x WOF strips. Set aside (3) strips for top and bottom inner borders.

From (5) strips, sub-cut:

- (2) 2" x 9 1/2" rectangles for star backgrounds.
- (7) 2" x 8" rectangles for star backgrounds.
- (5) 2" x 3 1/2" rectangles for blocks
- (10) 2" x 5" rectangles for blocks
- (10) 2" squares for blocks
- (6) 1 ½" x WOF strips. Sub-cut:
 (15) 1 ½" x 12 ½" rectangles for picket fence.
 (30) 1 ½" squares for picket fence.

From the Sun fabric, cut the applique. From the scrap, cut:

- (2) 5 ½" squares. Cut each square once on the diagonal for wonky geese.
- (5) 2 ¹/₂" squares for checkerboard.
- Save the remaining fabric for wonky star points.

From the Squash fabric, cut:

- (1) 6 ½" x WOF strip. Sub-cut:
 (2) 6 ½" squares. Cut each square once on the diagonal for wonky triangles.
 (1) 3" square for wonky star center.
 (4) 3" squares for block half square triangles.
 (4) 2 ½" squares for checkerboard.
 Save the remaining strip for wonky star points.
- (3) 2" x WOF strips. Sub-cut:
 (2) 2" x 3 ½" rectangles for blocks
 (10) 2" x 5" rectangles for blocks
 (7) 2" squares for blocks
 - (3) 2" x 6 ½" rectangles for blocks.
- Cut the applique pieces for the pumpkins and hat band. Save the remaining fabric for wonky star points.

From the Bluegrass fabric, cut:

- (1) 6 ½" x WOF strip. Sub-cut:
 (2) 6 ½" squares. Cut each square once on the diagonal for wonky geese.
 (7) 3" squares for block half square triangles. Save the remaining fabric for wonky star points.
- (2) 2 ½" x WOF strips. Sub-cut:
 (3) 2 ½" x 12 ½" rectangles for picket fence and
 (7) 2 ½" squares for checkerboard.
- (4) 2" x WOF strips. Sub-cut:
 (16) 2" x 5" rectangles for blocks.
 (2) 2" x 6 ½" rectangles for blocks.
 (14) 2" squares for blocks.
 (6) 2" x 3 ½" rectangles for blocks.

From the Cypress fabric, cut:

- (1) 6" x WOF strip. Cut the applique leaves from the strip. From the remaining fabric, cut:
 (7) 3" squares for block half square triangles.
- (4) 2" x WOF strips. Sub-cut:
 (16) 2" x 5" rectangles for blocks.
 (3) 2" x 6 ½" rectangles for blocks.
 (13) 2" squares for blocks.
 - (5) 2" x 3 ½" rectangles for blocks.

From the Caterpillar fabric, cut:

- (1) 6 ½" x WOF strip. Sub-cut:
 (1) 6 ½" square. Cut the square once on the diagonal for wonky geese. Cut the remaining strip into (2) 2 ½" x ~ 35" strips. Sub-cut:
 (3) 2 ½" x 12 ½" rectangles for picket fence.
 (3) 2 ½" squares for checkerboard.
 - (2) $2'' \times 6 \frac{1}{2}''$ rectangles for blocks.
- (1) 3" x WOF strip. Sub-cut;
 (1) 3" square for wonky star center.
 (11) 3" squares for block half square triangles.
- (5) 2" x WOF strips.
 - (24) 2" x 5" rectangles for blocks.
 - (22) 2" squares for blocks.
 - (10) 2" x 3 ½" rectangles for blocks.

Save the remaining fabric for wonky star points.

From the Pansy fabric, cut:

- (1) 6 ½" x WOF strip. Sub-cut:
 (2) 6 ½" squares. Cut each square once on the diagonal for wonky geese. Cut the remaining strip into (2) 2 ½" x ~ 29" strips. Sub-cut:
 (4) 2 ½" x 12 ½" rectangles for picket fence.
- (1) 3" x WOF strip. Sub-cut:
 (2) 3" squares for wonky star centers.
 (6) 3" squares for block half square triangles.
 (5) 2 ½" squares for checkerboard.
- (1) 8" x WOF strip. Cut the applique for the hat. Then cut the remaining fabric into 2" strips. Sub-cut: (14) 2" x 5" rectangles for blocks.
 - (2) 2" x 6 ½" rectangles for blocks.
 - (12) 2" squares for blocks.
 - (5) 2" x 3 ½" rectangles for blocks.
- You may need to cut (1) more 2" strip for above.
- Save the remaining fabric for wonky star points.

From the Fog fabric, cut:

- (1) 6 ½" x WOF strip. Sub-cut:
 (2) 6 ½" squares. Cut each square once on the diagonal for wonky geese.
 Cut the remaining strip into
 - (2) 2 ½" x ~ 29" strips. Sub-cut:
 - (2) 2 ½" x 12 ½" rectangles for picket fence.
 - (3) 2 ½" squares for checkerboard.
- (1) 3" x WOF strip. Sub-cut:
- (9) 3" squares for block half square triangles.
- (5) 2" x WOF strips. Sub-cut:
 (22) 2" x 5" rectangles for blocks.
 (4) 2" x 6 ½" rectangles for blocks.
 - (18) 2" squares for blocks.
 - (7) $2'' \times 3\frac{1}{2}''$ rectangles for blocks.
- Save the remaining fabric for wonky star points.

From the Bayou fabric, cut:

- (8) 2 ¹/₂" x WOF strips for binding.
- (1) 3" x WOF strip. Sub-cut:
 (1) 3" square for star center.
 (9) 3" squares for block half square triangles.
- (1) 2 ½" x WOF strip. Sub-cut
 (2) 2 ½" x 12 ½" rectangles for picket fence.
 (6) 2 ½" squares for checkerboard.
- (4) 2" x WOF strips. Sub-cut: (18) 2" x 5" rectangles for blocks. (1) 2" x 6 ½" rectangles for blocks. (17) 2" squares for blocks. (8) 2" x 3 ½" rectangles for blocks.

From the Camel fabric, cut:

- (1) 6 ½' x WOF strip. Sub-cut:
 (2) 6 ½" squares. Cut each square once on the diagonal for wonky geese.
 (2) 6" x 3" rectangles. Sub-cut (4) 3" squares for block half square triangles. Cut the remaining strip into:
 (2) 2 ½" x ~ 23" strips. Sub-cut:
 (1) 2 ½" x 12 ½" rectangle for picket fence.
 (8) 2 ½" squares for checkerboard.
 (2) 2" x 3 ½" rectangles for blocks.
- (3) 2" x WOF strips. Sub-cut:
 (10) 2" x 5" rectangles for blocks.
 (3) 2" x 6 ½" rectangles for blocks.
 (7) 2" squares for blocks.
- Use the remaining fabric for wonky star points.

From the Cayenne fabric,

• Cut the pumpkin applique pieces. From the scrap, cut:

(1) $6 \frac{1}{2}$ " square. Cut the square once on the diagonal for wonky geese.

- (2) 3" squares for wonky star centers.
- (5) 2 ½" squares for checkerboard.

From the Iceberg fabric, cut:

- (5) 3" x WOF strips. Sub-cut:
 (62) 3" squares for block half square triangles.
- (6) 2" x WOF strips. Sub-cut: (120) 2" squares for blocks.
- Save the remaining fabric for wonky star points.

Sewing Instructions:

Make the main background blocks, rows 2-6. Use (1)

color fabric plus Iceberg for each block.

For each main background block, you will need:

- (1) 3" color square
- (1) 2" x 3 $\frac{1}{2}$ " color rectangle
- (2) 2" x 5" color rectangles
- (2) 2" color squares
- (1) 3" Iceberg square
- (2) 2" Iceberg squares



To make (1) **A Block**, draw a diagonal line on the wrong side of a 3" Iceberg square. With right sides together, place the Iceberg square on a 3" color square. Sew ¼"

on each side of the line. Cut apart on the line and square up to 2" including seam allowances. Press seams toward the color fabric.

Sew a half-square triangle to opposite ends of a 2" x 3 ½" color rectangle. Note the orientation of the half-square triangles. Press seams toward the color fabric. Set aside.

Draw a diagonal line on the wrong side of (2) 2" Iceberg squares. With right sides together, place an Iceberg square on a 2" x 5" color rectangle, aligning the top edges. Note the direction of the drawn line. Sew on the line. Trim the seam to ¼" and press toward the corner.

Sew a 2" color square to the top of the unit. Press seams toward the color fabric. Repeat to make a second unit.

Arrange the (2) units and the first unit as shown in the Main A Block diagram. Sew together on the long edges to make (1) main background A block. Press the seams toward the center strip. Blocks should measure $5'' \ge 6 \frac{1}{2}''$ including seam allowances.







Main A Block

Make a total of (25) main background A blocks.

- (2) Black A blocks
- (2) Squash A blocks
- (6) Bluegrass A blocks
- (1) Cypress A block
- (4) Caterpillar A blocks
- (3) Pansy A blocks
- (1) Fog A block
- (5) Bayou A blocks
- (1) Camel A block

Make the main background **B Blocks** in the same manner as the A Blocks. Note the direction of the half-square triangles and the flip over corner are reversed. Press the seams in each strip in the opposite direction of the block A seams (see arrows). Press vertical seams away from the center strip.

Make a total of (25) main background **B blocks**.

- (3) Black B blocks
- (4) Cypress B blocks
- (6) Caterpillar B blocks
- (2) Pansy B blocks
- (6) Fog B blocks
- (3) Bayou B blocks
- (1) Camel B block

Main B Block

Make the background border

blocks, rows 1 and 7. Use (1) color fabric plus Iceberg for each block.


- For each background border block, you will need:
- (1) 3" color square (for two blocks)
- (1) 2" x 6 ½" color rectangle
- (2) 2" x 5" color rectangles
- (1) 2" color square


(1) 2" Iceberg square

- (1) 3" Iceberg square (for two blocks)

To make (1) **A Block**, draw a diagonal line on the wrong side of a 3" Iceberg square. With right sides together, place the Iceberg square on a 3" color square. Sew ¼" on each side of the line. Cut apart on the line and square up to 2" including seam allowances. Press seams toward the color fabric. You will only use (1) of the half-square triangles in each background border block.

Sew a half-square triangle to one end of a 2" x 5" color rectangle. Note the orientation of the half-





square triangle. Press seam toward the color fabric. Set aside.

Draw a diagonal line on the wrong side of (1) 2" Iceberg square. With right sides together, place the Iceberg square on a 2" x 5" color rectangle, aligning the top edges. Note the direction of the drawn line. Sew on the line. Trim the seam to ¼" and press toward the corner.



Sew a 2" color square to the top of the unit. Press seams toward the color fabric.

Arrange (1) $2'' \times 6 \frac{1}{2}''$ color rectangle, plus the first and second units as shown in the Border A Block diagram. Sew together on the long edges to make (1) background border A block. Press seams toward the center strip. Blocks should measure 5" x 6 $\frac{1}{2}$ " including seam allowances.

Make a total of (10) background border A Blocks:

- (2) Cypress A blocks
- (2) Caterpillar A blocks
- (3) Fog A blocks
- (1) Bayou A block
- (2) Camel A blocks

Make the background border

B Blocks in the same manner as the A blocks. Note the direction of the

half-square triangles and the flip over corner are reversed. Press the seams in each strip in the opposite

direction of the block A seams (see arrows). Press vertical seams away from the center strip.

Make a total of (10) background border **B blocks**:

- (3) Squash B blocks
- (2) Bluegrass B blocks
- (1) Cypress B block
- (2) Pansy B blocks
- (1) Camel B block
- (1) Fog B block

Assemble the background blocks.

Refer to the background block diagram as necessary.

Arrange (10) border blocks into a top row, • alternating A and B Blocks. Start the row with a B Block.

- Arrange the (50) main background blocks into (5) rows of (10) blocks, alternating A and B blocks. Start the first row with an A Block.
- Arrange (10) border blocks into a bottom row, alternating A and B Blocks. Start the row with a B Block.

Sew blocks into rows. Press each row in alternating directions. Sew the top three rows (including the top border row) together. This unit should measure 45 1/2" x 18 ½" including seam allowances. Set aside until you've added the cat and pumpkins applique.

Sew rows 4 through 7 together. This unit should measure 45 ½" x 24 ½" including seam allowances.

Make the picket fence.

Draw a diagonal line on the wrong side of (30) 1 1/2" squares. With right sides together, place the black square on a 2 ½" x 12 ½" Caterpillar rectangle, aligning the top left edges. Note the direction of the drawn line. Sew on the line. Trim the seam to ¹/₄" and press toward the corner. Repeat with the opposite top corner.

Make a total of (15) fence post units:

- (3) Caterpillar
- (4) Pansy
- (2) Bayou
- (2) Fog
- (3) Bluegrass
- (1) Tan

Refer to the quilt diagram if necessary.


Arrange the (15) fence posts into (1) row with a $1 \frac{1}{2}$ " x 12 ½" black rectangle between each post, and at the beginning of the row. Sew the row together. Press seams toward the black rectangles. This row should measure 45 ½" x 12 ½" including seam allowances.

Sew to the bottom of the background blocks bottom (rows 4-7) unit. Press the seam toward the background blocks.


Trim selvages and sew the black 2" x WOF strips together on the short sides to make one long strip. Subcut (1) 2" x 45 ½" strip and sew it to the bottom of the picket fence. Press the seam toward the black strip. Trim the remaining strip to 54 ½" for the top inner border. Set aside.

Use your favorite appliqué method to add the cat and pumpkins appliqué. Refer to the quilt diagram for placement.

Sew the top three block rows to the bottom section.



Border A Block







Sew the top three background block rows together.



Sew rows 4-7, the picket fence unit and the bottom inner border together.



Add the cat and pumpkin appliqué.

Make the border wonky flying geese units.

For each unit, you will need:

(1) 24 $\frac{1}{2}$ " x 6 $\frac{1}{2}$ " black rectangle (used in the bottom border) *or* (1) 27 $\frac{1}{2}$ " x 6 $\frac{1}{2}$ " black rectangle (used in the top border

(7) pairs of (2) same color triangles cut from the $6 \frac{1}{2}$ " squares.

Select a black 6 ½" x 27 ½" rectangle. On the wrong side of the fabric, use a light pencil to divide the strip into (7) sections, using a wonky angle as shown in the diagram. *Do this before you cut to ensure you don't end up with too many or too few sections.* Cut the strip apart on the lines.




Number each section (1-7) as shown. *I used a sharpie on a small piece of masking tape, placed in the center of each shape.*


Refer to the quilt diagram as necessary for color placement.


Select a color triangle. It may help to press a ¼" seam allowance on the long edge if this is your first time using this method. Place the triangle on a black wonky rectangle as shown in the diagram, right sides up. You want to make sure that the color triangle will cover the black rectangle once it is sewn.

Flip the triangle so that right sides are together and sew a ¼" seam on the long edge of the triangle. Press the triangle toward the corner. *Do not iron over the masking tape number!*

From the back, using the black wonky rectangle as a guide, trim the color fabric to match the black wonky rectangle shape. Carefully trim away the underneath black fabric to reduce bulk.







Repeat with the other side, using a same color triangle. You want enough overlap ($\frac{1}{4}$ " or slightly more) that the top seam allowance will not "eat" the tip of the center triangle).

Repeat with wonky rectangles 2 through 7. Sew the units 1 through 7 together in their original order. Press seams toward the top of the unit. The finished top wonky geese unit should measure 6 ½" x 24 ½" including seam allowances. Set aside to use in the top checkerboard/geese border.

Repeat this process with the 6 $\frac{1}{2}$ " x 24 $\frac{1}{2}$ " rectangle. The finished bottom wonky geese unit should measure 6 $\frac{1}{2}$ " x 21 $\frac{1}{2}$ " including seam allowances. Set aside to use in the bottom checkerboard/geese border.

Make the border checkerboard units.

Refer to the quilt diagram as necessary for color placement.

Sew (3) 2 ½" color squares together. Make a total of (4) CCC (color/color/color) units. These are for the start and ends of each checkerboard unit.

- (1) Fog/Pansy/Camel-press to center square
- (2) Fog/Bayou/Bluegrass-press to center square
- (3) Pansy/Bayou/Cayenne-press to center square
- (4) Cayenne/Bluegrass/Sun-press away from center square

Sew (2) 2 $\frac{1}{2}$ " black squares to both sides of a color square. Press seams toward the black squares. Make a total of (12) BCB (black/color/black) units.

Sew (2) 2 $\frac{1}{2}$ " color squares to both sides of a black square. Press seams toward the black squares. Make a total of (11) CBC (color/black/color) units.

For the top checkerboard unit, sew (7) BCB units and (6) CBC units together, alternating units. Sew a CCC unit to each end of the checkerboard. Press seams in one direction. The finished top unit should measure $30 \frac{1}{2}$ " x $6 \frac{1}{2}$ " including seam allowances. Sew to the right of the $6 \frac{1}{2}$ " x $24 \frac{1}{2}$ " wonky geese unit.

For the bottom checkerboard unit, sew (5) BCB units and (5) CBC units together, alternating units. Sew a CCC unit to each end of the checkerboard. Press seams in one direction. The finished bottom checkerboard unit should measure 24 $\frac{1}{2}$ " x 6 $\frac{1}{2}$ " including seam allowances. Sew to the left of the 6 $\frac{1}{2}$ " x 21 $\frac{1}{2}$ " wonky geese unit. Together they should measure 6 $\frac{1}{2}$ " x 45 $\frac{1}{2}$ ". Note the direction of the geese and sew this unit to the bottom of the quilt top. Press seam toward the black inner border.

Make the wonky star blocks.


For each wonky star you will need:

- (8) 3" black squares for star backgrounds
- (1) 3" color center square
- (8) ~2 $\frac{1}{2}$ " x ~4" color or white (Iceberg) rectangles.


Cut these from your scraps.

Refer to the quilt diagram as necessary for color placement.

- 1. Arrange the black 3" squares in a nine-patch with the 3" color square in the center.
- On each of the (4) star-point squares, place a ~2 ½" x 4" color rectangle across the background square at an angle with right sides together.



- Sew ¼" seam along the edge of the color star-point fabric.
- 4. Fold the star-point fabric over the background and press toward the corner. The color fabric should cover the background corner.
- From the back, using the background square as a guide, trim the star-point fabric to match the 3" square, then carefully trim off the underneath background fabric to reduce the bulk.
- Place another ~2 ½" x 4" color rectangle across the 3" square – the star-point fabric should overlap the star-point that you previously completed.




 Press and trim as before. Repeat process for the other (3) star-point

squares. Note: To make blocks more interesting, your star-points should be at different angles.

8. Sew your 9-patch star together, making sure the

points point towards the outside of the star. Blocks should measure 8" square including seam allowances. Press seams as shown by arrows.



Make a total of (7) dark wonky star blocks.

Sew a 2" x 8" black rectangle to (1) side of each block. Press away from the block. Refer to the diagram and arrange the (7) wonky star blocks into a column, rotating as necessary. The black spacer fabrics are in gray so you can see the placement easier. Press all seams toward the black rectangles.

- Sew a 2" x 9 ½" black rectangle to the top of the first star.
- (2) Sew a 2 ½" x 9 ½" black rectangle to the bottom of the second star.
- (3) Sew a 2 ½" x 9 ½" rectangle to the bottom of the third star.
- (4) Sew a 2 ½" x 9 ½" black rectangle to the bottom of the fifth star.
- (5) Sew a 2" x 9 ½" black rectangle to the bottom of the sixth star.

Sew the star units together, including the bottom star, to complete the column. The column should measure 9 ½" x 62" including seam allowances.

Sew the column to the left side of the quilt center. Press the seam toward the column.

Sew the black 2" x 54 ½" top inner border strip (that you set aside) to the top of the quilt top. Press the seam toward the black inner border. Sew the top wonky geese/checker board unit to the top of the quilt center. Press the seam toward the black inner border.


Trim selvages and sew (2) black 5 ½" x WOF strips together on the short sides. Press seam in one direction. Measure the quilt top vertically through the center and trim (1) strip to that length. Sew to the right side of the quilt top. Press the seam toward the black border.


Trim selvages and sew (3) 2 ½" x WOF strips together on the short sides. Press seams in one direction. Measure the quilt top horizontally through the center and trim (2) strips to that length. Sew to the top and bottom of the quilt top. Press seams toward the black borders.

Add the moon appliqué.

Sew ¹/₈" around the outside of the quilt top with a longer stay stitch. Quilt, bind and you're done! Enjoy!!

ALL IMAGES ARE REVERSED.

Section 1. Moon Top. Use the straight line to overlap pieces.

Section 2.

Upper left moon in this reversed image. It will be the upper right on the quilt top. Use the straight lines to overlap pieces.

Section 3.

Lower left moon in this reversed image. It will be the lower right on the quilt top. Use the straight lines to overlap pieces. This image is actual size.

Section 4.

Moon Bottom. Use the straight line to overlap pieces.
