Piece strips and sub-cut (2) 4" x 75 1/2" and (2) 4" x 82 1/2" strips.</p>

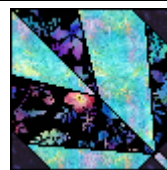
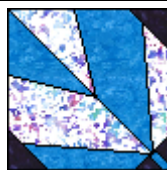
Constructing Pieced Blocks

General Paper-piecing instructions:

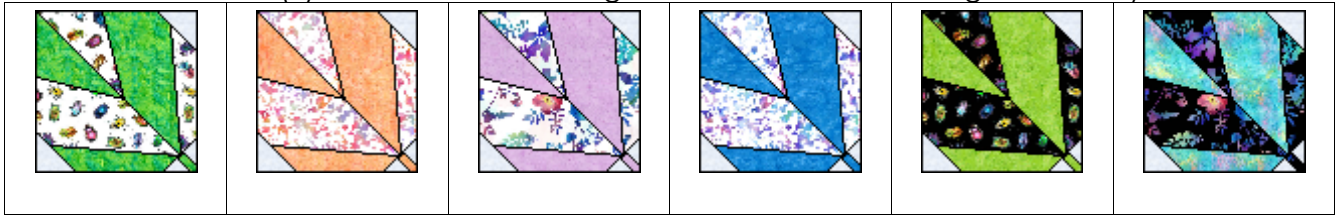
1. Print pattern onto foundation paper. The numbers on the pattern should be visible on both sides of the paper.
Note: Make sure the pattern prints at 100 percent.
2. Trim the printed pattern to size to include 1/4" seam allowance around the finished
3. Fabrics will be sewn to the foundation in numerical order. Using a dab of water soluble glue, place a first fabric piece right side up on the wrong side of the foundation covering all of first section on foundation paper pattern (denoted A1, B1, or C1 in the templates for this pattern).
4. Turn the foundation to the right side. Place the straight edge of an index card (or a piece of cardstock) on the line between first and second sections. Fold the foundation back over the straight edge of the card and trim the section one fabric 1/4" away from the fold.
5. Turn the foundation to the wrong side and place second fabric piece (A2, B2, or C2) on section 1 fabric, right sides together.
6. Turn the foundation to the right side and sew on the line between sections one and two to join the two fabric pieces. Use a shorter stitch length to help perforate the paper for easy removal.
Note: Sew directly on the printed line; do not sew beyond it.
7. Turn the foundation to the right side and place the edge of the index card on the sewn line. Fold the foundation back over the card and trim the fabric 1/4" away from the fold.
8. Turn the foundation to the wrong side and press section 2 fabric open.
9. Continue in the same manner and in numerical order until all sections are covered with fabric.
10. There are also many video tutorials available online for a visual guide on this technique.

1. Refer to quilt image for fabric placement guide, use foundation/paper piecing method to make A, B, and C sections. Sew together A and B sections, before adding C section to complete (1) blocks.

2a. Make a total of (5) blocks in the following fabric combinations for dark colorway:



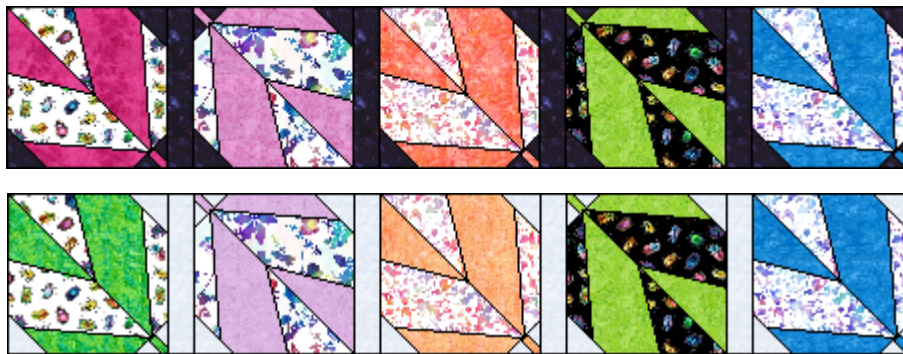
2b. Make a total of (5) blocks in the following fabric combinations for light colorway:



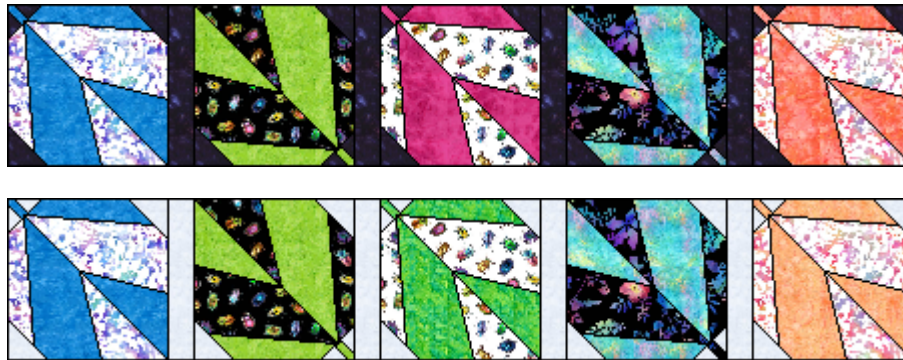
Quilt Top Assembly

1. Pieced row. Refer to quilt image and noting block orientations, arrange and sew together (5) pieced blocks and (4) 2 1/2" x 12 1/2" background sashing rectangles to make a pieced row. Make a total of (6) rows.

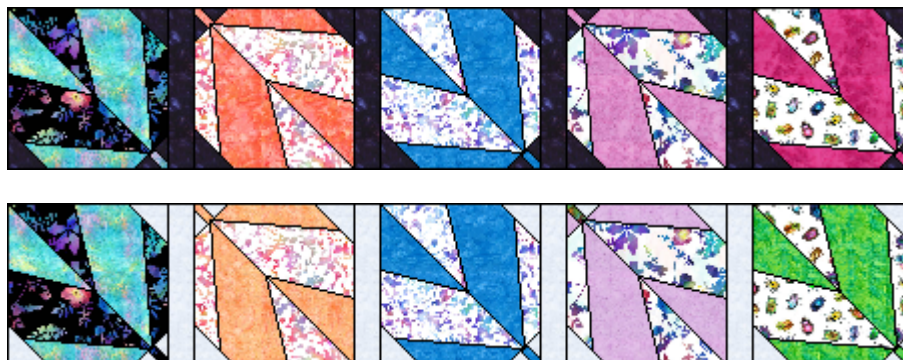

2. Sew together pieced rows and (5) 2 1/2" x 68 1/2" background sashing strips to complete quilt center.

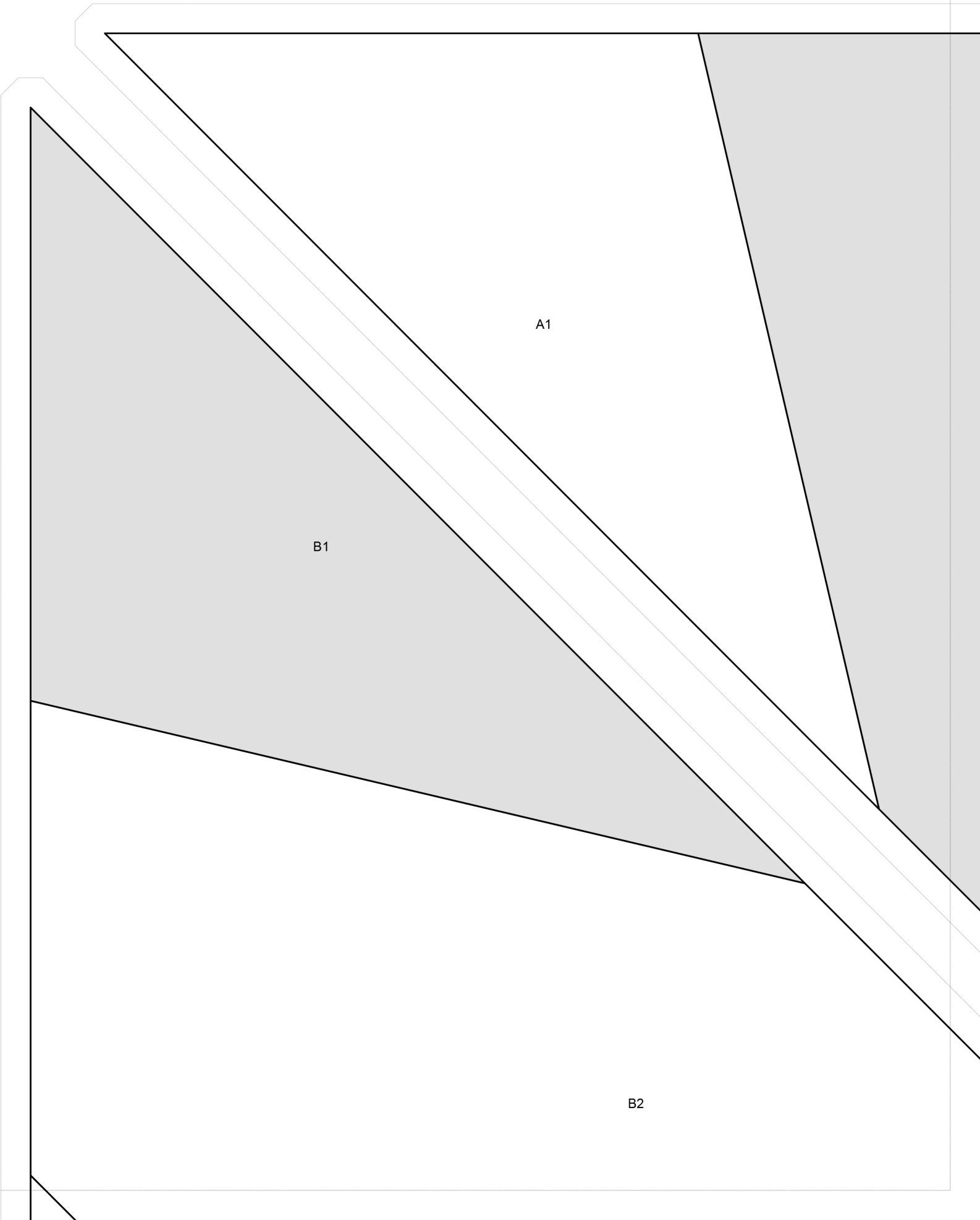
3. Outer border. Sew (2) 4" x 82 1/2" background strips to the opposite long sides of quilt center, followed by (2) 4" x 75 1/2" background strips to the remaining opposite short sides of quilt center to complete quilt top.





Quilting Instructions:

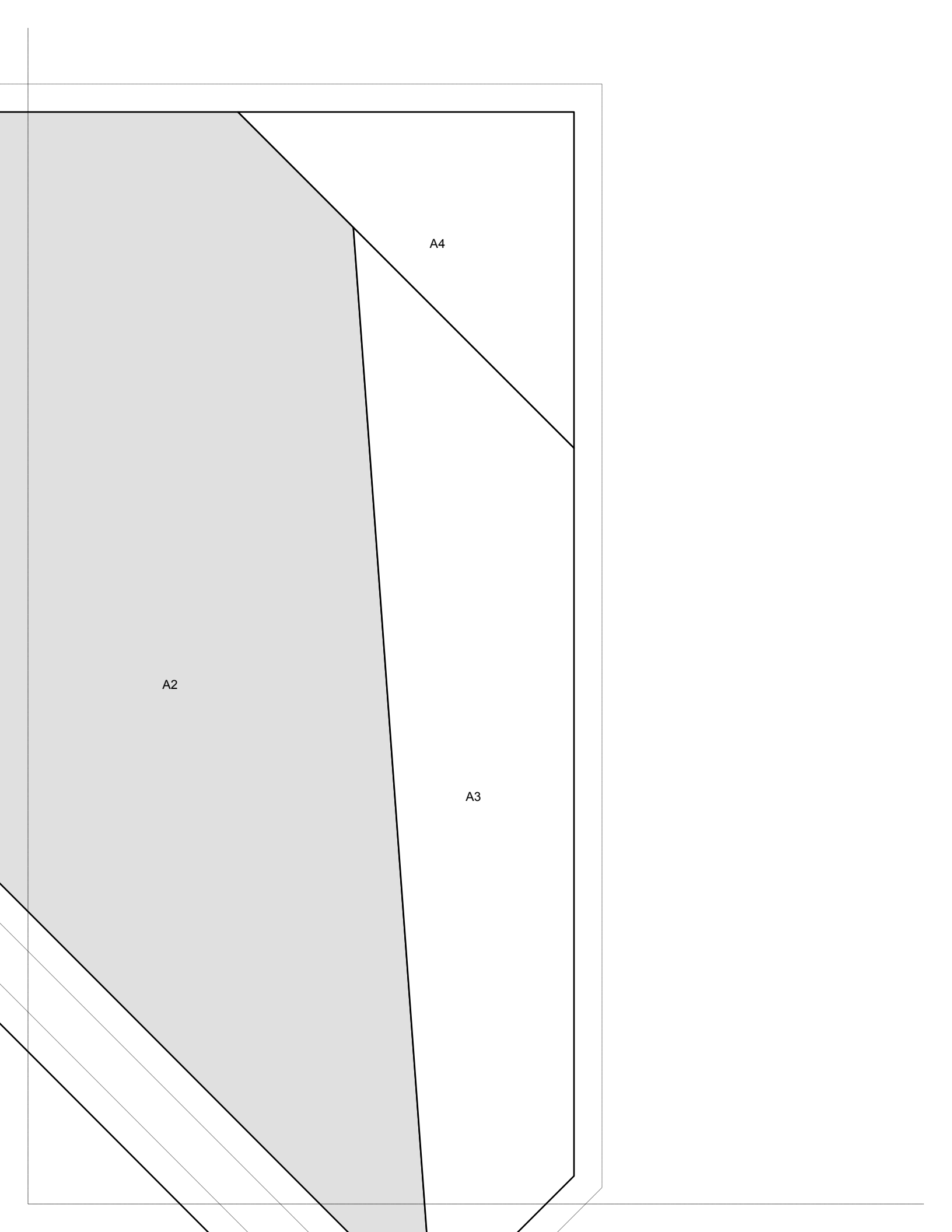
1. With the backing fabric laying taut, place batting and then quilt top to form quilt sandwich. Baste sandwich.
2. Quilt as desired.
3. Bind to finish quilt.
