# Twinkle

72 x 86

## Fabric Requirements:

Background—4  $\frac{1}{4}$  yards

Focal Prints (7 fabrics) -  $\frac{1}{4}$  yard each

Accents (4 fabrics) -  $\frac{1}{2}$  yard each

## Cutting Instructions:

From the background cut:

1 - 14  $\frac{1}{2}$  inch strip sub cut into:

(4) 7  $\frac{1}{2}$  x 14  $\frac{1}{2}$  inch units

6 - 8  $\frac{1}{2}$  inch strips sub cut into:

(28) 2  $\frac{1}{2}$  x 8  $\frac{1}{2}$  units and

(28) 4  $\frac{1}{2}$  x 8  $\frac{1}{2}$  units

6 - 6  $\frac{1}{2}$  inch strips sub cut into:

(28) 2  $\frac{1}{2}$  x 6  $\frac{1}{2}$  units and

(28) 4  $\frac{1}{2}$  x 6  $\frac{1}{2}$  units

10 - 4  $\frac{1}{2}$  inch strips sub cut into:

(56) 4  $\frac{1}{2}$  x 4  $\frac{1}{2}$  units and

(56) 2  $\frac{1}{2}$  x 4  $\frac{1}{2}$  units

From each of the 7 focal prints cut:

1 - 8  $\frac{1}{2}$  inch strip sub cut into:

(4) 8  $\frac{1}{2}$  x 8  $\frac{1}{2}$  squares (28) squares total

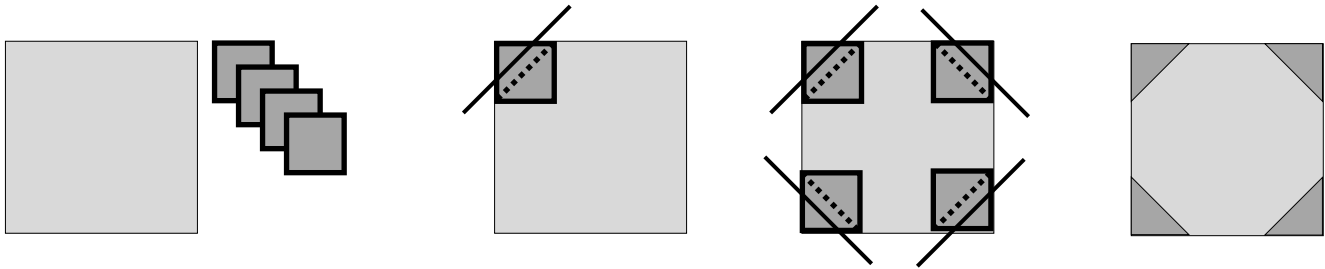
From each of the 4 accent fabrics cut:

6 - 2  $\frac{1}{2}$  inch strips sub cut into:

(84) 2  $\frac{1}{2}$  x 2  $\frac{1}{2}$  squares (336) squares total

## **Block Construction:**

1. Take (4) of one of the focal  $8\frac{1}{2} \times 8\frac{1}{2}$  squares and (4)  $2\frac{1}{2} \times 2\frac{1}{2}$  squares of each accent fabric (for a total of 16 small squares).
2. Start with one focal square and 4 accent squares from one of the fabrics.
3. Place one accent square in the top left corner of the focal with the right sides together. Draw a diagonal line from corner to corner as shown Sew on the diagonal line from corner to corner of the accent square. Sew 3 more accent squares to each of the other 3 corners on the focal square. Note the direction change of the diagonal for each corner. Cut off excess fabric  $\frac{1}{4}$  inch above seam line. Press the stitched block open.



4. Repeat this process with the other fabrics from step #1 until you have 4 total snowball squares made.
5. Follow steps #1-4 using the other focal fabric and accent squares to make snowballs. **Make sure that the focal squares are paired with each of the 4 accent fabrics yielding one of each snowball.**

**The steps below are all sewn in the same corner and the same direction.**

In the same way as the snowball technique before, sew one accent square to the bottom **left** corner of each background unit. See diagrams below. Note: this is a great time to string piece.

- ◆ Sew all (28)  $2\frac{1}{2} \times 8\frac{1}{2}$  background units and (7) squares of each of the four accent fabrics.
- ◆ Sew all (28)  $4\frac{1}{2} \times 6\frac{1}{2}$  background units and (7) squares of each of the four accent fabrics.
- ◆ Sew (28)  $2\frac{1}{2} \times 4\frac{1}{2}$  background units and (7) squares of each of the four accent fabrics.
- ◆ Sew all (56)  $4\frac{1}{2} \times 4\frac{1}{2}$  background squares and (14) squares of each of the four accent fabrics.



**The steps below are all sewn in the same corner and the same direction.**

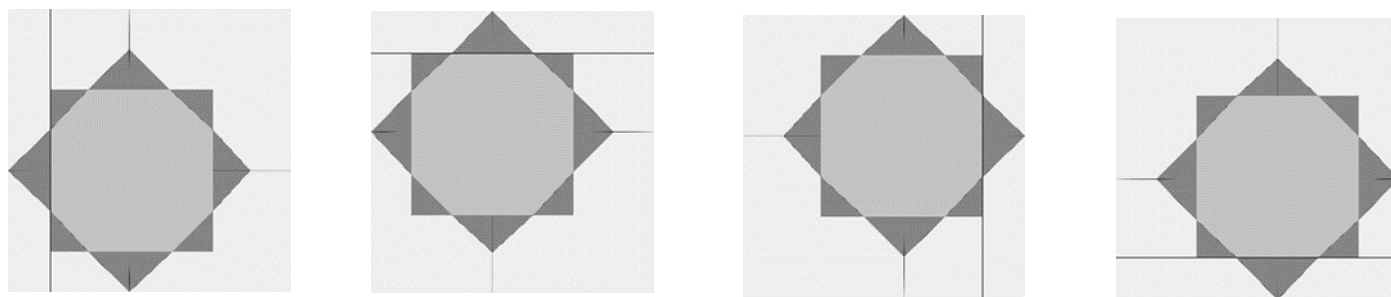
In the same way as the snowball technique before, sew one accent square to the bottom **right** corner of each background unit. See diagrams below. Note: this is a great time to string piece.

- ◆ Sew all (28)  $4\frac{1}{2} \times 8\frac{1}{2}$  background units and (7) squares of each of the four accent fabrics.
- ◆ Sew all (28)  $2\frac{1}{2} \times 6\frac{1}{2}$  background units and (7) squares of each of the four accent fabrics.
- ◆ Sew (28)  $2\frac{1}{2} \times 4\frac{1}{2}$  background units and (7) squares of each of the four accent fabrics.



**Block Construction:**

**Warning: If using any directional fabric follow these instructions before constructing the blocks. Take all (28) of the snowball blocks and layout in 5 columns of 5 or 6 blocks in each as shown in quilt layout. When satisfied, take each directional fabric block (one at a time) and construct block in the orientation shown in quilt layout for the corresponding place in the quilt. The 4 options are shown below.**

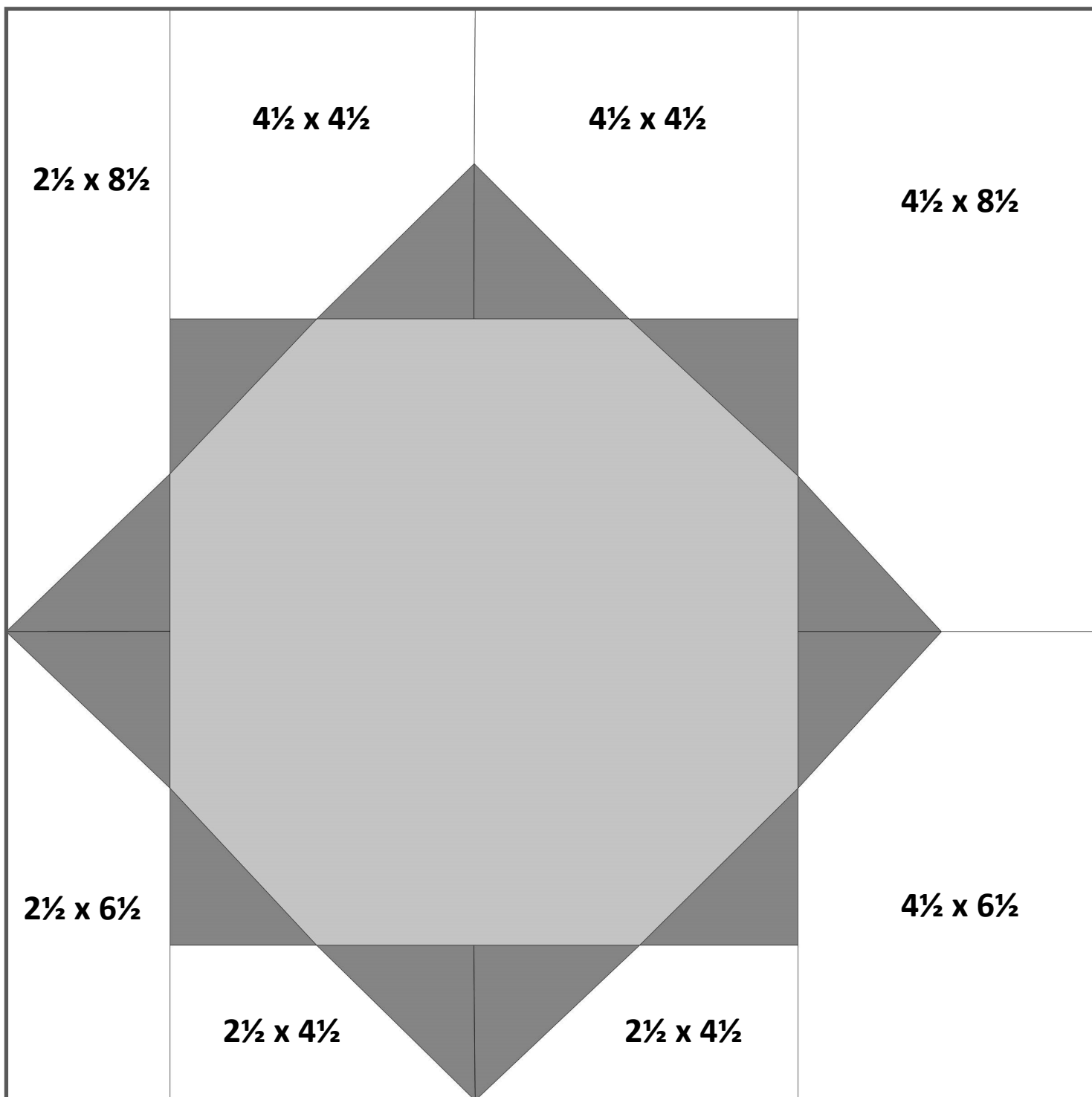


Once any directional fabric has been dealt with, take one snowball block at a time and match with the background corner snowballs using the same accent fabric.

You will need:

- ◆ 1 of each rectangle made
- ◆ 3 of the  $4\frac{1}{2} \times 4\frac{1}{2}$  squares.

Arrange all the pieces as shown in block below and sew together.



Sew blocks together in columns as shown then sew columns together.

Quilt and bind as desired.
