#### Cutting

Note: Fabric descriptions & figures are red/gold colorway.

Fabric #1 (gold print):

• 4 strips 3<sup>7</sup>/<sub>8</sub>" x WOF; subcut into 40 squares 3<sup>7</sup>/<sub>8</sub>" x 3<sup>7</sup>/<sub>8</sub>" (A)

Fabric #2 (white print):

• 7 strips 3<sup>1</sup>/<sub>2</sub>" x WOF; subcut into 40 rectangles 3<sup>1</sup>/<sub>2</sub>" x 6<sup>7</sup>/<sub>8</sub>" (B)

Fabric #3 (red print):

 10 strips 3<sup>1</sup>/<sub>2</sub>" x WOF; subcut into 40 rectangles 3<sup>1</sup>/<sub>2</sub>" x 9<sup>7</sup>/<sub>8</sub>" (C)

Fabric #4 (gold on white print):

- 4 strips 3<sup>7</sup>/<sub>8</sub>" x WOF; subcut into 40 squares 3<sup>7</sup>/<sub>8</sub>" x 3<sup>7</sup>/<sub>8</sub>" (D)
- 10 strips 3<sup>1</sup>/<sub>2</sub>" x WOF; subcut into 40 rectangles 3<sup>1</sup>/<sub>2</sub>" x 9<sup>7</sup>/<sub>8</sub>" (F)

Fabric #5 (green print):


- 7 strips  $2\frac{1}{2}$ " x WOF for inner border
- 7 strips 3<sup>1</sup>/<sub>2</sub>" x WOF; subcut into 40 rectangles 3<sup>1</sup>/<sub>2</sub>" x 6<sup>7</sup>/<sub>8</sub>" (E)
- 8 strips 2<sup>1</sup>/<sub>4</sub>" x WOF for binding

Fabric #6 (large floral print:):

• 8 strips 4<sup>1</sup>/<sub>2</sub>" x WOF for outer border

Piecing the blocks (finished block size 12<sup>3</sup>/<sub>4</sub>" x 12<sup>3</sup>/<sub>4</sub>")

Aligning the edges as shown in figure 1, sew A and C to opposite sides of B. Press all seam allowances in the direction of the arrows. The unit should measure  $97/8'' \times 97/8''$ .



Join A, B, C p Fig. 1

Trim from the corner of A to the corner of C (fig. 2). Discard the trimmings. This is unit X (fig 3). Make 40.






Cut from corner to corner Fig. 2

Unit X - Make 40 Fig. 3

Join D, E and F. Press seam allowances toward E. Trim from corner of D to the corner of F (fig. 4). Discard the trimmings. This is unit Y (fig. 5). Make 40.





Repeat with D, E, and F Fig. 4

Unit Y - Make 40 Fig. 5

Join an X unit and a Y unit (fig. 6). Press seam allowances open. Make 40 of these half blocks.



Join the half-blocks to complete a block (fig. 7). Make 20 blocks.

#### Assembling the quilt

Lay out the blocks in 5 rows of 4 blocks (fig. 8). Notice how every other block is rotated 90°. Sew the blocks into rows and press seam allowance open. Sew the rows together and press seam allowances open.

Sew the border #1 strips together into one long strip. Measure the quilt from top to bottom through the center of the quilt. Cut 2 border #1 strips to this measurement. Sew them to the sides of the quilt. Press seam allowances toward the border. Measure the quilt from side to side including the borders just added. Cut 2 border #1 strips to this measurement and sew them to the top and bottom of the quilt. Press seam allowances toward the border.


Add border #2 the same as border #1.

#### **Quilting & finishing**

Layer the backing, batting, and quilt top. Baste to secure. I quilted my Confetti Christmas with an allover holly design.

Finish the edges of your quilt with double-fold binding.

# *Triangle Play tablerunner* Bonus pattern by Marjorie Rhine of Quilt Design NW

Finished table runner size : 17<sup>1</sup>/<sub>4</sub>" x 38<sup>1</sup>/<sub>4</sub>"

The triangles cut off during Christmas Confetti blocka ssembly (fig. 2 & fig.4 i n Christmas Confetti instructions) can be used in other projects.H ere is a quick able runner that can be made from some of those triangles.P lay around with the other triangles to make a small project of your own design.

#### Additional materials:

For this design, you will need a square rotary-cutting ruler. If you want to use Hoffman's Winter Blooms fabrics for the borders (as shown in the table runner picture) you will need an additional

<sup>1</sup>/<sub>4</sub> vard of P7617-60G for inner border and <sup>3</sup>/<sub>8</sub> yard of P7609-78G floral for the outer border.


#### Additional cutting:


Border #1 - cut 3 dark green print strips 1<sup>3</sup>/<sub>4</sub>" x WOF. Border #2 - cut 3 floral print strips  $2\frac{1}{2}$ " x WOF.

#### Piecing

From the triangles left over from Christmas Confetti, select 36 red triangles, 36 dark green triangles, 8 white triangles, 10 gold triangles, and 36 gold on white print triangles. The triangles should measure about  $3\frac{3}{4}$ " x  $3\frac{3}{4}$ ".

Join a red triangle and a green triangle.P ress seam allowances toward the green triangle. Square up the unit to 3" x 3". Make 18 (fig. tr1). There will be red and green triangles left over. Join 2 gold triangles.P ress seam allowances to one side. Square up to 3" x 3". Make 5. Join 2 white print triangles.P ress seam allowances to one side. Square up to 3" x 3". Make 4.









the triangles not selected before trimming the remaining red and green triangles for the s project.

Trim the remaining red and green triangles so they measure  $3\frac{3}{8}" \ge 3\frac{3}{8}"$  (do not trim the gold-on-white triangles). To do this,l ine up one short edge of a triangle along the diagonal center line of a square rotary-cutting ruler.M ove the ruler until the other short edge is at the  $4\frac{3}{4}"$  mark. Make sure the other short edge is still on the center line, then trim the excess (fig. tr2). The short sides of the triangle should measure  $3\frac{3}{8}"$ .



Lay the pieces out for the gold-center rectangle block (fig. tr3). Sew together in diagonal block rows then add untrimmed white-on-gold print corner triangles.P ress seam allowances in the direction of the arrows.









Trim excess

Make 5 gold-center blocks. Repeat to make 4 white-center blocks (fig. tr5).



Following the table runner assembly diagram,s ew the block together in a vertical row,a lternating gold-center block with white-center block .P ress seam allowances open.

Sew the border #1 strips together.M easure the quilt to determine length of border needed, and sew to the quilt. Press seam allowances away from the center. Repeat for border #2.L ayer, quilt and bind.
